Temperature

With 3.2 inches of rain this month, we marked the 27th driest month since 1895. The total of 3.2 inches was more than an inch under the average benchmark. The precipitation events however were typical summer convective storms where it was just a hit or miss situation, and it just happened that this month was mainly a miss. Our temperatures however were slightly above average in all categories. Despite a very warm start to the month, a drastic temperature change going into the 11th kept temps either running below or right around average the rest of the month. This helped level off the average, though we still ended up slightly above. As we look ahead to September, we look for the coming equinox and the start of fall to bring about the colors and cooler temps to go along with that.
