Discussion

Despite setting three new record highs for the month, April still turned out to be below normal as a whole. The average temperature for April was 48.0 °F, almost one degree below average. We began the month well below average and even recorded 2.3" of snow on the 2nd. Temperatures slowly rebounded as we topped out the month at 90 °F on the 19th. This was the third record high in four days; the other two having been recorded on the 16th and 17th (both 87 °F). Unfortunately, the warm temperatures were short lived. Two days after reaching 90 °F, the high only made it up to 49 °F. Temperatures remained below average for much of the remainder of the month.

As for precipitation, we finished slightly over the average of 3.46 inches with 3.76 inches of total precipitation recorded. Nearly half of the months precipitation came on the 8th and 9th when we recorded 0.75 and 0.95 inches of rain, respectively. We missed most of the severe weather to the south but we did have a brief occurrence of hail (pea-size or smaller) late in the evening of the 28th. Expect the April showers to bring May flowers, and hopefully warmer temperatures too!
