# MONTHLY CLIMATE SUMMARY, NOVEMBER, 2005 NIU WEATHER SERVICE, DEKALB, IL 



## DISCUSSION

While the monthly average temperature was only a shade warmer than 30 year average, this November experienced some rather large swings above and below the normal. The month kicked off with a heat spell that resulted in daily maximum temperatures 10 to $20^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ warmer than average for almost a week. After a brief return to normal, temperatures again soared 15 to $18^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ above average before crashing $20^{\circ}$ overnight as a strong cold front brought DeKalb and the vicinity it’s first measurable snowfall of the season (11/17). Though the remainder of November saw a considerable return of warm, autumn-like weather, including a $58^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ high on the second to last day of the month ( $20^{\circ}$ above the normal), many people will remember Thanksgiving of 2005 as one of the coldest, if not windiest in a long time. The flurries we saw while eating leftover turkey sandwiches gave way to some copious rainfall over an inch in 3 days- bringing the monthly total precipitation up a little closer to the average. However, November is now the $9^{\text {th }}$ consecutive month with below normal precipitation.
Unfortunately, the combination of numerous motorists going to see family for the holiday and adverse driving conditions resulted in dozens of accidents the weekend following Thanksgiving. As winter is now upon us now, we must all remember to leave ourselves a little extra time to get where we're going, and get there in one piece.
